2012 Camp Schedule

Traditional Day Camp 8:30am-3:30pm

June 4 - June 8 (Home School 1)	(5 days)

Horse Day Camp

8:30 am - 3:30 pm

June 18 - 22	Level III
July 16 - 20	Level I
July 30 - Aug 3	Level II

Cost: \$275/wk

TERMS: 50% deposit needed to reserve space. Balance due 14 days before camp starts.

Refund Policy: We will issue full refunds for any camps WE cancel.

100 % refund if canceled 8 weeks before your camp date.

50% refund if canceled less than 8 weeks up to 3 weeks before your camp date.

0% refund if canceled less than 3 weeks before your camp date.

NEW FOR 2012:

This year to help keep cost in check for camp, you will need to provide a brown bagged lunch for your child. Camp will provide water, punch, Gatorade, popsicles and bagged snacks as needed. Please be sure your child's lunch is clearly marked and it will be refrigerated until lunch time.

- **Grants and Discount Guidelines for Camp Jabez**

Grants may be available for youth for regular day camps (not horse camps). Grants are based solely on donated funds for that purpose and are usually exhausted rather early in the season. The grant is based on HHS Poverty Guidelines found at:

A fifty percent discount is offered at one per family if qualified according to guidelines and other camp requirements. Income verification is required.

Hardship cases may be considered for additional discounts if funds exist. These are only considered near the end of camp when we know if there will be available funds.

An additional 10% off of regular price may be available to low income (125% of poverty guidelines) families sending two or more youth.

FYI:

Many children attend at no cost to the family because someone else pays the cost. If the child attending comes under the poverty guidelines, the paying person would still receive the 50% discount if camp grant funds were available for the balance of the cost.
